GOALS

Singers will be exposed to choral music from a wide variety of genres and styles from the standard choral tradition. Through daily vocal training and exercise, singers will gain greater skill and knowledge in using the human voice as a musical instrument. Through active participation in a large chorus, singers will gain an appreciation of the power and enjoyment of group singing. Through daily rehearsal, singers will increase the depth of their musical ability. And through performance, singers will experience musical expression at the highest level of artistry.

- 2) All required music, purchased from UD.* The student is responsible for all music for the duration of the semester. All music must be in hand for every rehearsal.

ATTENDANCE

1) Because of the limited number of rehearsals, attendance is required at every rehearsal. Missing a rehearsal will lower a student's final grade. For both students and non-students, absences could result in removal from the ensemble. Please note:

- a. Illness does not preclude rehearsal attendance. If you are too sick to sing, you should still attend rehearsal, listen, and take notes. However, if you feel you are contagious, please stay home.
- b. Missing more than 25% of one rehearsal constitutes an absence for that rehearsal.
- 2) In the event of illness or unavoidable absence, the director should be notified in advance through the online form. In addition, a singer who misses a rehearsal may be asked to spend time in **private coaching** with the director.
- 3) Scheduled performances and outside rehearsals are mandatory. A student who misses an outside rehearsal or scheduled performance will fail the class. A community member who misses an outside rehearsal or scheduled performance may be asked not to return to the ensemble.

EXAMINATIONS

Periodically the director may schedule examinations during which the singer must demonstrate mastery of an assigned portion of the music. Failure to show up for, or submit, a scheduled examination will result in a failure of the examination. A singer who fails to demonstrate mastery on the examination must re-take the exam.
