# Bachelor of Music in Applied Music - Instrumental Concentration

## General Statement

This document is an advisement tool to guide students toward graduation. ## Core Requirements of the Music Major

All undergraduate music majors at the University of Delaware must complete the following core courses in Harmony, Aural Skills, and Music History. Due to the stacking of pre- and corequisites, courses should be taken in the sequence outlined below to follow a four-year graduation timeline Each course has a minimum grade requirement of " C -."

Year 1, Fall:

- 0 cr. MUSC184: Music Fundamentals: Theory \& Fluency (Pass/Fail course)
- This course can be waived upon a passing score in the Music Theory Placement Test, administered during the first week of the semester.
- 3 cr. MUSC185: Aural Skills I

Year 1, Spring:

- 2 cr. MUSC186: Aural Skills II
- 3 cr. MUSC195: Harmony I

Year 2, Fall:

- 3 cr. MUSC196: Harmony II
- 3 cr. MUSC211: Music, History, and Ideas
- 2 cr. MUSC285: Advanced Aural Skills I

Year 2, Spring:

- 2 cr. MUSC286: Advanced Aural Skills II
- 3 cr. MUSC295: Advanced Harmony I
- 3 cr. MUSC311: Music History from 400-1600

Year 3, Fall:

- 2 cr. MUSC296: Advanced Harmony I
- 3 cr. MUSC312: Music History from 1600-1827

Year 3, Spring

- 3 cr. MUSC313: Music History from 1827 - present


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## Applied Music - Instrumental Requirements:

In addition to the core requirements listed above, students in the Applied Music - Instrumental program take the following major-specific courses. Each course has a minimum grade requirement of "C-."

## Recital Attendance

- Students must pass six semesters of 0 cr. MUSC100: Recital Attendance.


## Applied Music

- 22 credits from Private Study courses (MUSC151, 152, 251, 252, 357, 358, 457, and 458) are taken in succession during the eight semesters on campus. Students receive weekly 60 -minute individualized instruction, as well as a weekly 50 -minute Repertoire Class. Students on double reed instruments attend an additional 50-minute Reeds Class.

Comprehensive Recital
Students must complete two recitals in advance of graduation.

- 0 cr. MUSC301 Junior Recital: to be taken in the junior year.
- 0 cr. MUSC401 Senior Recital: to be taken in the senior year.


## Ensembles

- 12 credits of instrumental ensembles are required. Students complete this requirement by taking 1-2 credits per semester. Ensemble placement is determined by audition at the beginning of each semester and can be selected from:
- MUSC470: Marching Band
- MUSC471: Symphonic Band
- MUSC472: Wind Ensemble
- MUSC473: Symphony Orchestra
- MUSC477: Jazz Ensemble
- MUSC478: Percussion Ensemble
- MUSC430: Chamber Ensemble
- Guitarists must complete eight credits of MUSC430: Chamber Ensemble, and two credits of any School of Music ensemble.


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Class Piano

- 2 credits from Class Piano courses (MUSC175 and MUSC176) are taken in succession during the first two semesters on campus. Exemption examinations are available for students with piano experience upon request of the faculty.

Conducting

- 2 credits of MUSC335: Basic Conducting are required.

Music Literature

- 3 credits of MUSC403: Chamber Music Literature are required.
- 3 credits of MUSC405: Symphonic Music Literature are required.

Music Theory Electives

- 4-6 credits of Music Theory electives are required, and can be selected from:
- 3 cr. MUSC197: Jazz Harmony
- 2 cr. MUSC392: Contrapuntal Writing
- 2 cr. MUSC393: Keyboard Harmony
- 2 cr. MUSC431: Orchestration
- 3 cr. MUSC495: Analysis \& Interpretation


## General Music Electives

- 9-11 credits of music electives are required. This excludes private study on a primary instrument but may include two credits of ensemble.


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## University and College Requirements

Students in the Applied Music - Instrumental major must complete University-level and Collegelevel requirements, as outlined below.

A minimum grade of "C-" is required for all University Breadth, College of Arts \& Sciences Breadth, Seminar in Composition, and Second Writing courses.

A minimum grade of " $D$-" is required for First Year Seminar, Foreign Language, Mathematics, Discovery Learning Experience, Multicultural, Capstone, and Free Elective courses. A "C-" is required if the course is used to simultaneously satisfy one of the requirements listed above.

A "P" may satisfy the First Year Seminar, Discovery Learning Experience, and Capstone only if those requirements are offered strictly on a Pass/Fail basis.

University-level Requirements

- 3 cr. ENGL110: Seminar in Composition
- 1 cr. UNIV101: First Year Seminar
- 12 cr. University Breadth Requirements:

Must be selected from four different, non-MUSC subject areas. Courses from one category that are crosslisted with a subject area in another category are not included.

- 3 cr. Creative Arts \& Humanities
- 3 cr . History \& Cultural Change
- 3 cr. Social \& Behavioral Sciences
- 3 cr. Mathematics, Natural Sciences \& Technology
- 3 cr. Discovery Learning Experience:
- Satisfied with 4 cr. MUSC458: Private Study for Applied Music VIII
- 3 cr . Multicultural Requirement
- Capstone Experience:
- Satisfied with 4 cr. MUSC458: Private Study for Applied Music VIII


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## College-level Requirements

- 24 cr. College Breadth Requirements:

Up to 3 credits of non-MUSC courses from each of the University Breadth Requirement categories may be used to simultaneously satisfy the College of Arts \& Sciences Breadth Requirements. Courses in each Group must be selected from two different non-MUSC subject areas. Courses in one Group that are cross-listed with a subject area already represented in that Group are not included.

- 6 cr. Group A: Creative Arts \& Humanities
- 6 cr . Group B: History and Cultural Change
- 6 cr. Group C: Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 6 cr. Group D: Mathematics, Natural Sciences \& Technology
- 3-4 cr. Mathematics Requirement:
- Satisfied with MATH113, 114, 115, 221, or 241 pending Mathematics Placement Test.
- Foreign Language:

Students with four or more years of high school work in a single foreign language, or who have gained proficiency in a foreign language by other means, may attempt to fulfill the requirement in that language by taking an exemption examination through the Languages, Literatures and Cultures Department.

- 0-8 cr. completion of the intermediate-level course (106) in an ancient or modern language.
- 3 cr . Second Writing Requirement:

A second writing course involving significant experience including two papers with a combined minimum of 3,000 words to be submitted for extended faculty critique of both composition and content. This course must be taken after the student has completed 60 credit hours. Appropriate writing courses are designated in the course catalog.

- Can be satisfied with MUSC312, MUSC313, or MUSC407.


## Electives

After required courses are completed, sufficient elective credits must be taken to meet the minimum credit requirement of 126 credits for the degree.
