

# **Bachelor of Music in Music Education – Instrumental Concentration**

**Revised June 2020**

## **General Statement**

This document is an advisement tool to guide students toward graduation. ## **Core Requirements of the Music Major**

All undergraduate music majors at the University of Delaware must complete the following core courses in Harmony, Aural Skills, and Music History. Due to the stacking of pre- and corequisites, courses should be taken in the sequence outlined below to follow a four-year graduation timeline. Each course has a minimum grade requirement of "C-."

Year 1, Fall:

- 0 cr. MUSC184: Music Fundamentals: Theory & Fluency (Pass/Fail course)
  - This course can be waived upon a passing score in the Music Theory Placement Test, administered during the first week of the semester.
- 3 cr. MUSC185: Aural Skills I

Year 1, Spring:

- 2 cr. MUSC186: Aural Skills II
- 3 cr. MUSC195: Harmony I

Year 2, Fall:

- 3 cr. MUSC196: Harmony II
- 3 cr. MUSC211: Music, History, and Ideas
- 2 cr. MUSC285: Advanced Aural Skills I

Year 2, Spring:

- 2 cr. MUSC286: Advanced Aural Skills II
- 3 cr. MUSC295: Advanced Harmony I
- 3 cr. MUSC311: Music History from 400-1600

Year 3, Fall:

- 2 cr. MUSC296: Advanced Harmony I
- 3 cr. MUSC312: Music History from 1600 – 1827

Year 3, Spring

- 3 cr. MUSC313: Music History from 1827 – present

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## **Music Education – Instrumental Requirements:**

In addition to the core requirements listed above, students in the Music Education – Instrumental program take the following major-specific courses. Each course has a minimum grade requirement of "C-."

### Recital Attendance

- Students must pass six semesters of 0 cr. MUSC100: Recital Attendance.

### Applied Music

- 14 credits of Private Study courses (MUSC151, 152, 251, 252, 351, 352, and 451) are taken in succession during the seven semesters on campus. Students receive weekly 60-minute individualized instruction, as well as a weekly 50-minute Repertoire Class. Students on double reed instruments attend an additional 50-minute Reeds Class.

### Comprehensive Recital

- Students must complete a comprehensive recital in advance of the Student Teaching semester. Students enroll in the 0 credit MUSC301: Junior Recital course during the semester of their recital.

### Ensembles

- 2 credits of MUSC470: Marching Band are required, excluding students with primary instruments of double reeds, piano, or strings.
- 5-7 credits of instrumental ensembles are required. Students complete this requirement by taking 1 credit per semester in advance of the Student Teaching semester. Ensemble placement is determined by audition at the beginning of each semester and can be selected from:
  - MUSC470: Marching Band
  - MUSC471: Symphonic Band
  - MUSC472: Wind Ensemble
  - MUSC473: Symphony Orchestra

### Class Piano

- 4 credits of Class Piano courses (MUSC175, 176, 275 and 276) are taken in succession during the first four semesters on campus. Exemption examinations are available for students with piano experience upon request of the faculty.
- Students whose principal instrument is piano and who take Private Study in piano will substitute 4 credits of MUSC155 for Private Study in a secondary instrument.

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## Secondary Instruments and Class Voice

- 4 required credits:
  - 1 cr. MUSC214 Stringed Instruments I
  - 1 cr. MUSC215: Brass Instruments I
  - 1 cr. MUSC217: Woodwind Instruments I
  - 1 cr. MUSC219: Percussion Instruments
- 2 additional credits selected from the following advanced-level courses are required:
  - 1 cr. MUED178: Class Guitar for Education
  - 1 cr. MUSC216: Brass Instruments II
  - 1 cr. MUSC218: Woodwind Instruments II
  - 1 cr. MUSC222: Stringed Instruments II
- 1 credit of MUSC174: Class Voice: Beginning is also required.

## Music Education Methods

Courses in Music Education Methods are dispersed throughout seven semesters in advance of the Student Teaching semester, and include:

- 1 cr. MUED179: Freshman Seminar in Music Education
- 2 cr. MUED277: Introduction to Music Education
- 1 cr. MUSC335: Basic Conducting
- 1 cr. MUED337: Instrumental Conducting
- 3 cr. MUED377: Elementary General Music Methods
- 3 cr. MUED379: Music in Elementary and Junior High (or Middle) School
- 3 cr. MUED479: Secondary Music Materials and Approaches

## Professional Studies

Courses in Professional Studies are dispersed throughout eight semesters and include:

- 3 cr. HDFS201: Life Span Development (recommended) or 4 cr. EDUC413: Adolescent Development and Educational Psychology
- 3 cr. HDFS202: Diversity in Families (recommended) or 3 cr. EDUC419: Diversity in Secondary Education
- 3 cr. EDUC414: Teaching Exceptional Adolescents
- 12 cr. EDUC400: Student Teaching

## Music Electives

- Five credits of music electives, excluding private study on primary instrument, are required.

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## **University and College Requirements**

Students in the Music Education – Instrumental major must complete University-level and College-level requirements, as outlined below.

A minimum grade of “C-” is required for all University Breadth, College of Arts & Sciences Breadth, Seminar in Composition, and Second Writing courses.

A minimum grade of “D-” is required for First Year Seminar, Foreign Language, Mathematics, Discovery Learning Experience, Multicultural, Capstone, and Free Elective courses. A “C-” is required if the course is used to simultaneously satisfy one of the requirements listed above.

A “P” may satisfy the First Year Seminar, Discovery Learning Experience, and Capstone only if those requirements are offered strictly on a Pass/Fail basis.

### University-level Requirements

- 3 cr. ENGL110: Seminar in Composition
  
- 1 cr. UNIV101: First Year Seminar
  
- 12 cr. University Breadth Requirements:  
Must be selected from four different, non-MUSC subject areas. Courses from one category that are cross-listed with a subject area in another category are not included.
  - 3 cr. Creative Arts & Humanities
  - 3 cr. History & Cultural Change
  - 3 cr. Social & Behavioral Sciences
    - Satisfied with 3 cr. HDFS201: Life Span Development
  - 3 cr. Mathematics, Natural Sciences & Technology
  
- 3 cr. Discovery Learning Experience:
  - Satisfied with 12 cr. EDUC400: Student Teaching
  
- 3 cr. Multicultural Requirement:
  - Satisfied with 3 cr. HDFS202: Diversity in Families
  
- Capstone Experience:
  - Satisfied with 12 cr. EDUC400: Student Teaching

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## College-level Requirements

- **15 cr. College Breadth Requirements:**

Up to 3 credits of non-MUSC courses from each of the University Breadth Requirement categories may be used to simultaneously satisfy the College of Arts & Sciences Breadth Requirements. Courses in the A, B, and D categories must be selected from non-MUSC subject areas. Courses in the Group C category must be selected from two different non-MUSC subject areas. Courses in the Group C category that are cross-listed with a subject area already represented in that Group are not included.

  - 3 cr. Group A: Creative Arts & Humanities
  - 3 cr. Group B: History and Cultural Change
  - 6 cr. Group C: Social and Behavioral Sciences
  - 3 cr. Group D: Mathematics, Natural Sciences & Technology
  
- **3-4 cr. Mathematics Requirement:**
  - Satisfied with MATH113, 114, 115, 221, or 241 pending Mathematics Placement Test.
  
- **3 cr. Second Writing Requirement:**

A second writing course involving significant experience including two papers with a combined minimum of 3,000 words to be submitted for extended faculty critique of both composition and content. This course must be taken after the student has completed 60 credit hours. Appropriate writing courses are designated in the course catalog.

  - Can be satisfied with MUSC312, MUSC313, or MUSC407.

## **Electives**

After required courses are completed, sufficient elective credits must be taken to meet the minimum credit requirement of 128 credits for the degree.
